is well on the path to becoming one of the two largest economies in the world by 2047. By accomplishing specific goals during the Amrit Kaal, the government strives to achieve the vision India@100. The goal of Amrit Kaal is to create a united India where the level of facilities does not divide villages and cities. The aim is to develop the country

into a fully developed nation by the time it celebrates its 100th year of independence in 2047."

He further mentioned, "Viksit Bharat@2047 underscores the importance of inclusivity, with targeted initiatives to uplift marginalized communities, empower youth, and reduce inequalities across regions and sectors."

"India is setting ambi-

tious goals for 2047, aiming for a \$30 trillion economy, universal access to water and housing, empowering farmers and increasing affordable medication access. These goals, part of the "Viksit Bharat" vision, represent a comprehensive socio-economic development plan for the country." He added.

Dr. Rakesh Mohan also shared vivid insights on macro trends shaping the Indian economy and vision for Viksit Bharat. He stressed on the development of manufacturing sectors of India and mentioned that manufacturing units need special emphasis in the industrial development and revival of India. To him, India's pace in development has quailed down because manufacturing sector has not performed satisfactorily. R. K.
